Introduction of new members	The EMSC Advisory Committee welcomed Renee Houston in her role as the new <i>EMS State Agency Representative</i> and Rodney Geilenfeldt in his role as the new <i>EMT or Paramedic Currently a Practicing Prehospital Provider</i> .
EMSC Update	- Stacy Rodgers informed the committee that the Idaho Bureau of EMS moved to the Idaho Military Division as of July 1, 2025. The new office is located at Gowen Field. Stacy anticipates that the program can now go back to sponsoring conferences and events as it had done in the past. - The EMSC Newsletter will make a come back with the next issue coming out in October 2025. Stacy advised the committee to send any content they would like to include in future newsletters regarding pediatric education or trainings. - The EMSC grant is in the process of changing entities from DHW to IMD. Funding is on hold until this transition has been completed. - Stacy notified members that the 2025 edition of Broselow Tapes should be shipped in a couple weeks. EMSC is partnering with the Healthcare Preparedness Program (HPP) who will be funding the tapes so that EMSC can ensure they are distributed to hospitals and agencies who utilize them. - All Carter Kits have been disseminated. Stacy is keeping a list of any inquiries to determine if there is a high enough need to order more kits in the future.

Pediatric Readiness Hospital Recognition Program	• Idaho currently has 6 hospitals recognized • At least 5 more hospitals may be recognized by the end of 2025 • The committee reviewed HRSA required and PRRPC recommended criteria and determined what should be added to the program.
Pediatric Readiness Prehospital Recognition Program	• Members reviewed HRSA required and PRRPC recommended criteria to determine what should be included in the program. The remaining recommended criteria will be reviewed at the next meeting. • The committee approved the design for the Idaho Pediatric Readiness Prehospital Recognition Program that will be utilized on the banner, manual, and any other materials. • Stacy discussed the remaining items that need to be finalized prior to rolling out the prehospital recognition program. These items include having a specific verification process, creating the application, and making a manual. The committee agreed to target mid 2026 for piloting the program but will decide an actual date at the next meeting.
Next meeting	• The next meeting will be virtual in October 2025 • Members agreed to continue holding the in person meeting annually in April.
